Downtowners Around Town

Meet the Police Mounted Unit

Ignoring the threat of rain, on August 29, 2023
Downtowners gathered in a remote corner of Long's
Park to tour the stables of the **Lancaster City Police Mounted Unit**. Officer McDonald, a 14-year Mounted
Unit veteran, addressed its history, the variety of its
duties, and the horses; the group then entered the
stables to meet the three Percherons.

Lancaster's Mounted Unit was founded in 1979. Its primary duties include patrolling in the city—particularly in the downtown business district; performing community engagement with schools and groups like the Downtowners; and assisting other police forces at large-scale events. For example, members of the unit helped with crowd control and safety when Pope Francis visited Philadelphia in 2015.

The three black male Percherons are distinguished by their facial markings. King, the tallest and heaviest of the three, has a white patch often hidden by his forelock; Jake has a longer white blaze; Angus, the newest addition to the unit, has a white blaze that extends all the way down his nose. The Mounted Unit is in the process of acquiring another horse to reach its full complement of four mounted pairs.

Aside from the officers' salaries, all expenses for the Mounted Unit are paid by the <u>Lancaster City Police</u> Foundation, which welcomes donations.

After the program ended, most of the group moved to a nearby picnic area in the park for a BYO lunch and social time, thankful that the rain held off.

Updated COVID-19 Vaccination

On September 12, 2023, CDC recommended a COVID-19 vaccine updated for 2023-2024 for everyone aged 6 months and older to protect against serious illness. They should be available at the end of the week.

The main reason to get vaccinated against COVID-19 is to protect yourself against severe illness, hospitalization, and even death. COVID-19 vaccines also reduce the chance of having Long COVID. This vaccine is expected to provide better protection against variants that are currently making people sick.

The updated COVID-19 vaccines are similar to earlier COVID-19 vaccines that were safely administered to hundreds of millions of Americans during the pandemic.

Bob moved to Lancaster from North Carolina just over a year ago. As soon as he arrived, he joined Downtowners. He submitted paperwork to volunteer for Just One Call and has been helping Downtowners ever since.

Most of Bob's calls have been for transportation. Although he signed up for light housekeeping and snow removal, he has not yet answered any calls for either. He has had only one home repair request, and when he checked up months later he was pleased to see that the repair has lasted.

Every driving assignment has given Bob the opportunity to meet Downtowners. Time spent together during a drive provides opportunities for good dialogue, especially during longer trips such as those to the Harrisburg airport. When Bob meets up with these people at other events or around town, they are now acquaintances -- familiar faces to someone recently relocated from North Carolina.

Bob sees many good reasons for Downtowners to use JOC volunteer support and he believes it is wise to accept assistance in view of the small disabilities that occur with aging. Asking for help with tasks that could once be easily managed on our own is a smart approach to successful aging. Healthy aging includes accepting changes and learning how to work with them. Through helping others, Bob recognizes he may one day ask for the kind of support he currently provides.

Bob encourages Downtowners to volunteer and to call for volunteer support when needed.

Bob also takes daily walks around town, picking up litter, armed with a grabber and a plastic bag. Welcome to our Lancaster community, Bob Bennett. Thank you for bringing your spirit, insights, and helping hands into our lives.

The Mount Gretna Art Show

If you've ever been to Mt Gretna in Lebanon County, you know what a tranquil place it is, with it's dense tree cover, biking and hiking trails, paths lined with quaint cottages and the Mt. Gretna Theatre as reasons to visit. Once a year over a weekend in late August however, that all changes.

This year the Chautauqua Community of Mt. Gretna held its 49th Annual Outdoor Juried Art Show with a crowd reported to be around 10000 people. Talented artists and crafters from all over the country displayed their creative works under those big majestic trees, and the vibe of this usually peaceful community is transformed into something special.

As visitors wander the paths lined with tents displaying art in all forms, the large parking lot which is usually filled with cars for ice cream at the popular Jigger Shop, becomes a large tent enclosed food court, while another area nearby has local talent performing throughout the day. Outside of the Hall of Philosophy behind the Jigger Shop, you had an opportunity to enjoy beer, wine or mead, and not far away on the Hall's porch, a young lady was selling some very delicious cupcakes. An added bonus to the show is a second area across the road and next to the entrance to the rail trail where more artists and crafters display their work.
